Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th July 1830 entitled An Act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows

State of Massachusetts - Essex county do: On this eleventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four before the Honorable Daniel A. White, Judge of Probate for said county personally appeared Betty Colman, widow of Newbury county and State of Massachusetts, aged seventy three years and upwards, who being first duly sworn, according to Law, doth and doeth, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the pension made by the Act of Congress passed July 7th 1830, entitled an Act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows: That she was formerly in the wife of Daniel Emory, who was then of said Newbury since deceased, that her said husband the said Daniel Emory, as she has always understood and believed, and does sincerely believe, was a private, and served in the Army of the United States, in the war of the Revolution, more than six months, in different campaigns, and as she has occurred to believe, a further term, that he first entered in a company commanded by Captain Silas Adams, in which he served at Rhode Island, the full term of six months, in the year 1776, and afterwards in a company commanded by Captain Thoman Mayhew, in a regiment and Colonel Wade, in which he served three months, in the year 1781 - That all which, and such further service, as he performed and also of manner, she cannot more particularly state, she respectfully doth leave to refer to the rolls and documents, which she believes to be on file in the Office of the Secretary of War, at Washington, and such as she is enabled to annex to this declaration.

And the said Betty Colman doth further on her said oath declare that she was lawfully married to the said Daniel Emory, at said Newbury by the Reverend David Tappan on the 22 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven. That her said husband the said Daniel Emory died at Newbury on the 22 December day of one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, that after the decease of the said Daniel Emory - she continued with Moses Colman an said Newbury, on the 1st day of December A.D. 1787 that the said Moses Colman deceased at said Newbury on the 27 day of August

A.D. 1807. And she is now remaining the widow of the said Moses Colman, and
has not intermarried since his decease.

That she was not married to the said David Emery, her said first husband,
previous to his leaving the said service, but the marriage took place previous to
the first day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety four, as she has
her own debed - all which will appear by the papers annexed.
